

# Message from Father Bobbin

Dear Parishioners,

As we journey through the Bible, we've spent the last month or so on the Historical Books of the Old Testament. There are three groups of Historical Books: 1. the Deuteronomic History (Joshua to Kings), 2. the Chronicler's History (Chronicles, Ezra, Nehemiah), and 3. miscellaneous.

We've looked at the first two groups. Which "miscellaneous" books remain? The books of Ruth, Tobit, Judith, and Esther are entertaining short stories about the characters for whom the books are named. Some of what we find in these books may be "historical fiction," that is, stories *based on* real people and events, rather than history strictly speaking. They teach lessons about God's divine providence, being faithful to God, the role of prayer and living a good life, and so forth.

The Book of Ruth is a very short story about a woman (Ruth) who is *not* a member of the Chosen People. She goes out of her way to care for her mother -in-law who is left widowed. Ruth puts her faith in the God of Israel, marries into the Chosen People, and becomes the great-grandmother of King David.

The Book of Tobit is a very colorful (and even comical) story about two righteous people who experience great suffering. Tobit is blinded. Sarah is cursed by a demon: she marries several times only to have the demon kill her husband on their wedding night. Assisted by the angel Raphael (in disguise), Tobit's son Tobiah sets off on a quest to heal his father's blindness. The stories about Tobit and Sarah converge as Tobit is healed and Sarah is freed from the demon. The marriage of Tobiah and Sarah creates the perfect happy ending to the story.




