#### FAMILY MATTERS

For Those Struggling to Find God in Their Families – God is in the ordinary events of our family life. All we need to do is look. We ask that the Spirit of God enlighten our families to see His presence in our loved ones and in the quiet or tumultuous moments of family life.

FROM OUR PARISH NURSE ... If you have asthma, a vitamin D supplement, taken along with standard medication, may help prevent attacks, according to a new Cochrane review, which looked at nine clinical trials involving children or adults, most with mild to moderate disease. It found not only that people who took the supplements had fewer asthma attacks than those taking a placebo, but also that they were one-third less likely to have an attack requiring steroid medication, and two-thirds less likely to have an attack requiring a trip to the hospital. However, vitamin D was not associated with improved lung function or day-to-day symptoms. It's not known what dose is optimal (dosage ranged from 400 to 4,000 IU a day, or 60,000 IU a month, in the studies) nor how baseline vitamin D status affected the results. Moreover, the benefits were seen mainly in adults, so more research is needed, particularly involving children with arthritis.

# ROSARY REPAIR

Parishioner, Paul Gombola, repairs rosaries on a case by case basis and each situation offers its own unique challenges. A damaged rosary can be dropped off at the Rectory or at Paul's home. If you have all the parts, a very simple repair is usually FREE. When the repair is more complex and requires additional parts or rewiring, this can be accomplished with minimum cost for \$5 or \$10. In extreme cases where parts need to be ordered the repair cost can be \$20 or over. Feel free to call Paul and discuss your problem over the phone. If your rosary is missing a piece of chain, a crucifix, centerpiece or several beads, Paul has several on hand and will attempt to match them as closely as possible. This service is provided FREE.
