Dear Parishioners,

In this Sunday's readings, the first reading from Sirach tells the people they can choose to follow the Commandments or not. But keeping the Commandments will save them. In St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians, he writes of the greatest of greatness prepared for those who love God.

In today's gospel Jesus came to fulfill the law so that heaven could be open to the righteous. In Matthew's gospel Jesus teaches about the law. He says that he has come to fulfill the law and that those who keep it will be called the greatest in the kingdom of heaven.

Jesus' teachings are not primarily about the joys and the easiness of the Christian life, but rather about the Commandments that our loving God gives to us for our freedom and good. He who is perfect love, made us in love and sent his son out of love to teach us what it means to partake in his life – both here and forever.


