



Message from Father Bobbin

Dear Parishioners,

Last week we were looking at the ceremony of Baptism step-by-step. We reached the moment of Baptism itself: the pouring of water accompanied by the words: "*(Name)*, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

Immediately after this, the child is anointed a second time. We pointed out the anointing before Baptism with the Oil of Catechumens. The second anointing is done with a different oil: Sacred Chrism, the most important of the holy oils used in the sacraments. When a person or thing (a new altar, for example) is anointed with Chrism, it is a sign of *consecration*: this person or object is now permanently set apart for a sacred purpose. Baptism permanently makes us God's sons and daughters. We take on a resemblance to Christ, the Son of God. The priest or deacon anoints the child by making a cross on the top of his / her head with the Chrism.

Next the child is presented with a white garment. (Or it is acknowledged that the child is already wearing a white garment, as most do for Baptism.) This is symbolic of our new identity. It also represents a commitment. Just as we would not want to get immaculately white clothing dirty, we do not want to obscure our Christian identity with sin.

The child is then presented with his or her baptismal candle. The candle is lit from the Paschal Candle, the symbol of the risen Christ, because Baptism joins us to the Paschal Mystery of our Lord's saving death and resurrection. The child is told to "receive the light of Christ" and to keep the light "burning brightly."

A final symbolic gesture is the prayer over the child's ears and mouths. Just as Jesus enabled the deaf to hear and the mute to speak, we pray that the child will grow to listen to God's Word and proclaim the Gospel.

Because Baptism makes us God's adopted sons and daughters, we are able to address God as our Father. Thus, the ceremony concludes by praying the Lord's Prayer, and then imparting a final blessing on the child's mother, on the father, and then on all present.



GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

What struck me when I first read this passage from the Book of Genesis, in which the Lord speaks to Abraham, is God's proclamation that it is through *his will* and *his work* that the blessings and goodness of Abraham's future will come about. It is not a vague statement, in which the subject is omitted. God clearly says, "I will make your name great." Abraham was a faithful servant of God and sought to obey God's will, but that is not what made his name memorable. It is due to God's will and generosity that Abraham's blessings came about. I sometimes struggle with giving up credit for the good things in my life. I want to believe that *my work*, *my talents*, and *my dedication* have brought about these good things. But the reality is that all of who I am and the skills that I have is a gift. I was created by God and formed by others to hone certain dispositions and talents that have led to my accomplishments. When we come to realize that all we have is a gift, we are able to offer our lives back to be transfigured and glorified by God, who creates and gives all things.

REFLECT

Reflect on the gifts and talents you have been given, as well as the accomplishments that have come about because of these gifts. Take a moment to thank God for all that he has given to you, and ask him to reveal how you can be a witness to his goodness through the prudent use and celebration of these gifts.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Many scholars identify this moment of the Transfiguration as the climax of the narrative arc of the Gospels, after which Christ's actions lead to his suffering and death. In his passion, Christ demonstrates the ultimate submission to the will of God, taking on the weight of human sin in order to redeem us. In this moment of Transfiguration on the mountain, we glimpse the beauty of the glorification that will result from this perfect obedience to God's will. We, too, are called to surrender ourselves fully to God. Following Jesus' model of humble submission to the Father's will does not involve false humility, in which we are self-deprecating or overly critical of ourselves. Instead, we are called to acknowledge and celebrate our gifts and accomplishments, while also recognizing that who we are and the gifts that we have come from our generous and loving God.
