# FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

A holy encounter with God causes us to act on our faith.

In this Sunday's readings Abram is sent by God to a new land so that from him God will create a new nation. In the second reading Timothy is encouraged to hear his share of the hardships in living and proclaiming the gospel. And in the gospel we hear the Transfiguration of Jesus where he takes Peter, James and John up the mountain and is transfigured before them.

When Peter witnesses this Transfiguration of Jesus and the appearance of Moses and Elijah, his first instinct is to "freeze that moment," by providing tents for the three of them. But that encounter, like any encounter with God's majesty and providence, is not meant to be frozen or hidden in a tent. It is meant to move us forward in and to act upon our faith.
