

Message from Father Bobbin

Dear Parishioners,

Mass Intentions

Holy Week is the high point of the year as we celebrate the central mysteries of our Christian faith. I encourage you to enter deeply into this week and participate in the liturgies as much as possible.

On Holy Thursday we celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper at 7pm to commemorate the institution of the Eucharist and the priesthood. At the end of Mass, the Eucharist is taken in procession to the chapel. The absence of the Eucharist in the main church and the night of private prayer before the Eucharist in the chapel recalls Jesus' prayer in the garden and arrest after the Last Supper.

On Good Friday we remember the death of Jesus. This is the only day of the year when Mass is not celebrated. At 3pm, the traditional hour of our Lord's death, we celebrate a unique liturgy consisting of readings from Scripture, including the Passion According to John, special intercessory prayers for the world, veneration of the cross, and the opportunity to receive Holy Communion, consecrated at Thursday evening's Mass.

Holy Saturday is a day of waiting until we celebrate the Easter Vigil at 8pm, the greatest liturgy of the year. Using the symbolism of light and darkness, we bless and light a new Paschal Candle, the symbol of the risen Jesus. We listen to a series of Scripture readings that recount God's saving work in history, culminating in the Resurrection. We then celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation. We will welcome Chanyu Jung and Luke Scheifley into the Church family as they are baptized. We will also welcome Mackenzie Miller more fully into the Church family as she makes a profession of the Catholic faith. All three will then receiving the sacraments of Confirmation and the Eucharist.

The more fully we participate in Holy Week, the more deeply we can come to appreciate our faith, and the more joyful and meaningful our celebration of Easter will be.

April 2, 2023 | Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

Is 50:4-7 | Phil 2:6-11 | Mt 26:14-27:66

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

As we begin Holy Week, we hear Matthew's account of the Passion. We see Jesus' humanity as he experiences sorrow and distress in the hours before his death. Three times, he asks the Father to "let this cup pass from me, yet, not as I will, but as you will." In our own human experience, I am guessing many of us have asked the Father to "let this cup pass" - for in addition to life's joys, we will all experience setbacks, struggles, and suffering. By example, Jesus shows us that we can turn to our Father, trusting in his will for us. Let this be a reminder in this holiest of weeks that we can bring our suffering and our doubts to the Father, knowing that the joy of Easter will come.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

The final words of today's Gospel [shorter version] are those of the centurion and the men keeping watch over Jesus: "Truly this was the Son of God!" Let us keep in mind this central proclamation of our faith while attending Triduum services this week. On Holy Thursday. we remember the Last Supper and the institution of the Eucharist and the priesthood, celebrating Christ's outpouring of love for us. On Good Friday we venerate the cross as we solemnly recall the passion and death of Jesus. And of course at the Easter Vigil and on Easter Sunday, we celebrate the story of our salvation, culminating in Jesus' resurrection. As Christians, we know that the cross will give way to the empty tomb and the promise of new life in Christ. Let our voices be strong this week as we echo the centurion's words above, and may Jesus' name be praised forever!
