

## Message from Father Bobbin

Dear Parishioners,

I wish you a very happy Easter. But I wish you a happy Easter not in the same way we tell each other to have a good day or have a good weekend. Easter is not another holiday. We do not want to reduce it to just a day when we go to church and then rest and celebrate with family before getting back to our routines on Monday (or Tuesday or Wednesday if you're fortunate enough to be on a school calendar).

Easter is what makes us Christian. Easter is the point where our faith goes from the *past* to the *present*. Jesus is risen. That means He is not just another figure who lived long ago in history. He lives among us today and He is present with us in our times of prayer, in the sacraments, in the inspired words of Sacred Scripture, and in the Church, His Body. Furthermore, Easter shows that Jesus conquered sin and death. This opens a future for us beyond our wildest imagination. We do not have to fear anything in this life, no matter how terrible it seems.

Easter is not just something we celebrate. It is something we live. We live in a friendship with the risen Jesus who is present to each and every one of us. We approach life with a new perspective: the suffering and challenges we experience in life do not have to conquer us, but they can simply be crosses that lead to small "resurrections" on our way to the perfect life of heaven.

I pray that you know the presence of the risen Jesus in your life and the joy and hope that come from His resurrection.

#### GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Happy Easter! When I think about Easter when I was a child, I admit that many of my memories are centered more around its symbolic trappings: Fannie Mae Easter eggs and peppermint ice cream, my grandma's table set just so, and unseasonably cold Easter egg hunts. While I may not have yet fully understood the theology of the Resurrection, being at Mass with my family and taking part in the celebratory activities engendered in me the disposition of which the psalmist speaks: This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad. Today's readings invite us to see both the secular and the sacred with new eyes. The fact that Jesus took on our humanity, died and rose again give us a glimpse of the joy that awaits. The simple pleasures we experience at Easter and throughout the year hint at what the Lord has in mind for all of us. In the meantime, we can turn to Jesus for encouragement, with the knowledge that God is present in the ordinary and extraordinary people and events in our daily lives.

#### GO EVANGELIZE PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

After Mary Magdalene discovers the empty tomb, Simon Peter and "the other disciple" (John) don't walk – but run to the tomb. I'm struck by the detailed account that follows. Peter "saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place." The words that follow seem contradictory: "Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead." Their understanding would grow in the hours and days that followed. These early witnesses would then share the Good News of Jesus' resurrection, often at the cost of their own lives, building up the Church that endures today. Like the disciples, we, too, are commissioned to witness to our faith in the risen Jesus, sharing this life-changing reality with others through our words and actions.

**PRAY** As this Easter season begins, we celebrate Christ's triumph over death, yet mourn that death still comes so violently for so many around the world. Make an extra effort – an extraordinary effort – this week to pray for peace in the world.
