 Dear Parishioners,

In the reading from Acts of the Apostles this weekend, St. Luke describes the early Christian community as they devoted themselves to prayer, the communal life, and the breaking of the bread. Peter's letter stresses the living hope that believers now have through the Resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. And in John's gospel for this Sunday, the Resurrected Jesus appears to his disciples saying, "Peace be with You" and showing them his wounds. He breathes on them and says "Receive the Holy Spirit" and grants them the authority to forgive sins. Later, He convinces Thomas of the truth of the Resurrection.

This Sunday the church continues to celebrate and give thanks for the mystery of the Resurrection. But this Sunday is also known as Divine Mercy Sunday. We are reconciled to God in His Divine Mercy through His Son. God has anointed His only Son as our Redeemer and Savior. So with hearts full of joy, and hope and faith, let us be reconciled to God and His Divine Mercy and share that mercy with the world.

CEMETERY REGULATIONS

- Please note ... all Christmas Wreaths & Decorations must be removed as soon as possible
- All decorations must be removed within 14 days after specified holidays which are: Easter, Mother's Day, Memorial Day, Father's Day and Christmas.
- All decorations except those flowers or plants planted in the ground, must be removed by July 1st
- Placing of artificial flowers in the ground is forbidden.
- All rubbish is to be taken with you or placed in receptacles at Cemetery.
