FROM OUR PARISH NURSE ... If you take medication for hypertension and feel faint or dizzy, tell your doctor, since it may be a sign that your blood pressure is dropping too low, which can cause falls. In a study in the American Journal of Preventive Medicine in October, researchers looked at medical records of 478,000 patients in Southern California who were being treated for hypertension. They found that the 27% of patients whose systolic blood pressure dropped below 110 mm Hg at one or more medical visits during a oneyear period were twice as likely to experience a serious fall or fainting episode as patients whose treated blood pressure was above 110 at all visits. Systolic is the first of two numbers given for blood pressure; below 120 is considered normal. For people with hypertension, the American College of Cardiology and the American Heart Association last year lowered the recommended systolic treatment goal to below 130, though some other expert groups still set it at 130 or 150, depending on cardiovascular risk. Lower blood pressure targets are a "significant concern for adverse events including falls," according to the researchers.

WHAT'S YOUR CATHOLIC IQ?

As she prayed in front of the tabernacle one day, Jesus (in the Eucharist) left the tabernacle and floated over her head. The priest took the host and gave her Communion.
- **5. (d)** All over the world, Mass is celebrated in the Catholic Church every day to honor Jesus' request.
- **6. True**. Matrimony calls a couple to holiness and service, primarily through their selfless and generous love for each other and their children.
- **7. (d)** In Penance, Jesus forgives our sins. In the Anointing of the Sick, Jesus heals the sick. In the Eucharist, Jesus feeds us with his body and blood.
- **8. (c)** Chrism oil is used for anointing at Baptism and Confirmation. It must be made from pure olive oil and is usually scented with balsam. It must be blessed by a bishop, usually at a diocesan Chrism Mass once a year on Holy Thursday.
- **9.** (a) "Holy Orders is the sacrament through which the mission entrusted by Christ to his apostles continues to be exercised in the Church until the end of time."
- **10. (b)** The Liturgy of the Word includes readings from the Old and New Testaments, the homily, and the intercessions.
- **11. True.** Even though Catholics are only required to go to Mass once a year during Easter season, Catholics know that Mass is essential for their relationship with God and go as often as possible.
- **12.** (a) "Confirmation gives us a special strength of the Holy Spirit to spread and defend the faith by word and action as true witnesses of Christ, to confess the name of Christ boldly, and never to be ashamed of the Cross."
- **13. (d)** Jesus said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."
- **14. (d)** After crossing the Red Sea, Moses and the Israelites sang praises to God and King David wrote the psalms as songs to God. Mass songs are often verses in the Bible.
