CEMETERY REGULATIONS

The following are guidelines established by St. John's Cemetery Committee:

- Shrubs are not permitted on cemetery grounds except those authorized by cemetery authorities.
- Flowers or plants may be planted in the ground, but must remain within 12 inches of base of memorial.
- All artificial decorations must be removed within 14 days after specified holidays which are: Easter, Mother's Day, Memorial Day, Father's Day, Christmas.
- All decorations except those flowers or plants planted in the ground, must be removed by July 1st
- Placing of artificial flowers in the ground is forbidden.
- All rubbish is to be taken with you or placed in receptacle in Cemetery.

ROSARY REPAIR

Parishioner. Paul Gombola. repairs rosaries on a case by case basis and each situation offers its own unique challenges. A damaged rosary can be dropped off at the Rectory or at Paul's home. If you have all the parts, a very simple repair is usually FREE. When the repair is more complex and requires additional parts or rewiring, this can be accomplished with minimum cost for \$5 or \$10. In extreme cases where parts need to be ordered the repair cost can be \$20 or over. Feel free to call Paul and discuss your problem over the phone. If your rosary is missing a piece of chain, a crucifix, centerpiece or several beads, Paul has several on hand and will attempt to match them as closely as possible. ANSWERS TO WHAT'S YOUR CATHOLIC IQ? GOD'S "TOP TEN" LIST – KID'S OUIZ

1.(b) God wrote the 10 Commandments with his finger (See Exodus 31:18)

2. (a) Moses served as the mediator between God and the Israelites (see Exodus 19:16-25).

3. (d) The Seventh Commandment says: "*Thou shalt not steal*." God knows it will hurt others if we take their things.

4. False. Moses was on Mount Sinai, the place where Moses first met God in the burning bush (see Exodus 3).

FROM OUR PARISH NURSE ... People who have coronary artery disease or heart failure should consider taking omega-3 (fish oil) supplements, according to a new scientific advisory from the American Heart Assoc. That goes along with the AHA's prior recommendation that such people consume 1,000 milligrams of omega-3s a day, on average, preferably from fatty fish. For those who don't get enough from fish, supplements are a "reasonable" option, after discussion with their doctors. The new advisory concluded that there is insufficient evidence from clinical trials to support the use of omega-3 supplements for prevention of cardiovascular disease in the general population; there was no consensus about supplements for people who are a high risk but have no history of cardiovascular disease. The advisory did not address people with very high blood levels of triglycerides, for whom high-dose prescription omega-3 preparations are a standard treatment.
