Message from Father Bobbin

Dear Parishioners,

On Sunday, May 18 at the 10:30 Mass, we will celebrate an Anointing Mass. Anointing of the Sick is one of the seven sacraments in which we encounter the power of the risen Jesus touching our lives. Like the Sacrament of Reconciliation, Anointing is a sacrament of healing.

Many Catholics only know this sacrament as the "Last Rites" and as something that is only for people on their deathbed. This is only partly true. Anointing of the Sick is for the dying, the seriously ill, people of advanced age, and people who are about to have surgery. The purpose of the sacrament is healing. What kind of healing? Possibly physical healing, if it's God's will. The sacrament definitely causes some measure of spiritual healing in the form of peace, comfort, a strengthening of one's faith, a reminder that one is part of the Church family, the grace to carry one's suffering in union with Christ, and forgiveness.

Anointing of the Sick is usually given in hospitals, nursing homes, and private homes, for obvious reasons. However, for people who are mobile, it is possible to celebrate this sacrament within Mass, which is what we will do on May 18. If you believe that you or a family member would be an appropriate recipient of Anointing for one the above reasons (advanced age, serious health difficulties, planning to have surgery), please call the rectory to register. It is very important that we know who is receiving the sacrament so we can properly record it in the Church's sacramental registers. There will be pews reserved in the front of church for people planning to receive the sacrament on May 18. A family member or caregiver is welcome to sit with the recipient. Please let us know if you have any questions in the next few weeks.



GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

On this Easter Octave, we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. As Jesus revealed to the Polish nun St. Faustina Kowalska, the blood and water that gushed forth from his side during his crucifixion would become a "fountain of mercy" for all of us. In today's first reading, we witness what happens now that the Apostles have received that mercy flowing from the foot of the cross. Motivated by the mystery of Jesus' resurrection and ascension and emboldened by the gift of the Holy Spirit, these men are now continuing his ministry of healing. Just as the ill and possessed flocked to Christ, so now those sick in body or spirit see the power of Christ working through the Apostles. The beauty of receiving God's mercy is that it doesn't stop once it's been poured into us – his mercy *compels us*, inspiring us to become living fonts of mercy to those we encounter.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

In a somewhat confusing chronology, today's Gospel takes place in time before the events in our first reading. So we go with the disciples back to "the evening of that first day of the week." They have been through a lot over the past weeks. They have watched their community turn on Jesus and give him over to be brutally killed. They have walked with him through his agonizing passion and bitter death, and they have witnessed his glorious resurrection from the dead. "Overwhelming" seems too small a word. Can you imagine the weight of their experience on a physical, emotional, and spiritual level? Now, in today's Gospel, we see them gathered together behind locked doors, shaken from the recent events, and fearing for their own lives. Somehow, mysteriously, Jesus enters the room and says, "Peace be with you." Three times, Jesus repeats this phrase to his disciples in this reading. Untethered by space and time and in the wake of grief and glory, the Savior of the world extends himself in an intimate encounter, radically present to those who love him.

REFLECT

Throughout today's Scriptures, we see the Lord's relentless pursuit of the human heart. We see a God who loves us so passionately that he pours himself into us, inviting us to partake in his mission by the outpouring of his mercy and the power of his Holy Spirit. Today, pause to reflect on the mercy of God. In what areas of your life can you see God's mercy at work? How can you be an instrument of his mercy for others?

Prayer for Vocations

Heavenly Father, Lord of the harvest, call forth vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life from our diocese and our families. Inspire men to imitate Christ, the Eternal High Priest, in sacrificial service to your Church. Move the hearts of men and women to offer themselves wholly to You in poverty, chastity and obedience. Send them as laborers for Your harvest. Inspire the faithful to support them with prayers and sacrifice. Raise up holy families who foster openness to your call. We ask this through Christ Our Lord. Amen.
