# Message from Father Bobbin

### Dear Parishioners,

This Thursday we celebrate the Ascension of our Lord. Forty days after Jesus rose, He "ascended" into heaven. This does not mean He literally went away from us into the sky. This mystery we call the Ascension is simply the end of Jesus' appearances in His risen body. This makes sense because, if Jesus were still walking around in His risen body, like He did in those first forty days, He could only be in one place at a time. Now, however, Jesus can be universally present to all people, allowing each and every one of us to develop an intimate friendship with Him.

One of the most special ways Jesus communicates His presence to us is the Holy Eucharist. Jesus' presence in the Eucharist is the very center of the life of our parish, and every parish. We gather as a family for Mass every Sunday and there are opportunities for Mass and Adoration throughout the week.

In a few weeks, on Sunday, June 12, we will celebrate a "Eucharistic Day" to further highlight and honor our Lord's presence with us. At the end of the 10:30 Mass, the Eucharist will be exposed on the altar for prayer throughout the afternoon. We hope that you can return to church sometime during the afternoon to spend some quiet time with our Lord. At 5:00pm we will end our Eucharistic Day with a short liturgy of Scripture readings, a homily by Father Dave, a procession and Benediction.

Please try to join us on June 12. Hopefully our Eucharistic Day will become an annual celebration.



#### Grave Lots \$ 600.00 each which includes Perpetual Care

#### **Regulations / Guidelines**

The following are guidelines established by St. John's Cemetery Committee ...

- \* Shrubs are not permitted on cemetery grounds
- \* Flowers or plants may be planted in the ground, but must remain within 12 inches of base of memorial. **NO** Perennials are permitted.
- All artificial decorations must be removed within 14 days after specified holidays which are: Easter, Mother's Day, Memorial Day, Father's Day, July 4, Christmas, etc.
- \* Placing of artificial flowers in the ground is forbidden
- \* All rubbish is to be taken with you or placed in available receptacles located at top of cemetery
- Please refrain from placing any tombstone in or on the grounds for one year after a death to allow the ground to settle back to its natural state.

May 22, 2022 Sixth Sunday of Easter Written by THE FAITHFUL DISCIPLE

Acts 15:1-2, 22-29 | Rev 21:10-14, 22-23 | Jn 14:23-29

#### GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

In the reading from John's Gospel today, Jesus eases into the message he has for his disciples - a message he knows they don't want to hear: He has to leave them. But Jesus tells his disciples that if they love him and keep his commandments, he and the Father will "make their dwelling" within them. He then assures them they will not be alone: The Advocate will come to not only remind them of all he taught them, but also teach them everything they need to know in the future. Finally, he offers them peace, the peace that comes only through the Spirit and draws them closer to God. Though Jesus knows they are broken-hearted that he is leaving, he tells them to rejoice if they love him, for he is returning to his Father. Jesus' words to the first disciples ring true for every disciple throughout the ages. He does not leave anyone who loves him alone. He sends his Spirit to dwell in us, to teach and remind us of his love and how to love one another. The Spirit guides us, encourages us, and sustains us - always. We are never alone.

#### GO EVANGELIZE PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

The first Christians, guided by the Holy Spirit, shared this message with the Gentile communities to whom they were ministering: "It is the decision of the Holy Spirit and of us not to place on you any burden beyond these necessities." This is a profound moment in the Church as it shows first, the power of the Holy Spirit working in and with the Apostles; and second, the importance of faith (not ritual circumcision, or other human laws) for salvation. The Gospel is intended for all, without exception, and the Holy Spirit is our help and our Advocate in our own lives of faith, and in our sharing of that faith with others. Let us seek the counsel of the Holy Spirit in all we do, that we might be a blessing, not a burden, for everyone seeking the glory of God's light.

**STUDY** The Acts of the Apostles is an amazing account of how Jesus' followers grew from a small group of frightened people into the courageous and zealous missionaries who founded his Church. Read the *catechism* from 687-747 to learn more about the Holy Spirit and pray for the grace to let him work in and through you for the salvation of all who seek him.
