From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ also known as Corpus Christi. In celebrating this feast, we acknowledge the wonderful gift of Holy Communion, and its implication for our daily nourishment. God gives his only Son, Jesus Christ, to and for us. This feast also highlights Jesus' desire to remain with us after his death, to be the life-giving presence that we count on. God desires to be present to us permanently in the person of Jesus our Redeemer.

We experience that presence each day as we share in Holy Communion, the unique sacramental presence of Christ, received as nourishment in the form of bread and wine, our spiritual food. That presence is enhanced in the daily lives of those whose Baptism and nourishment of the Eucharist allows them to live Christ's life within them by going out in service to the needs of others, especially the poor. By being nourished with the Eucharist— Christ's body, blood, soul, and divinity—Jesus continues to live vibrantly in his people present and active in our world.

This year in our diocese we are celebrating the Year of the Real Presence, a time in which we are called to come back to Church and to receive Christ in the Eucharist and to know that Jesus is truly present in those forms of bread and wine, that they are transubstantiated into the Body and Blood of Jesus. This is what he gave us at the Last Supper as a sign of the covenant (A New Covenant) in the blood that he shed for us.

This is a profound mystery that expresses the realities of how God relates to us. God loves us, cares for us, forgives us, and invites us into life. He invites us to make a difference in our world. By coming back to the real presence and receiving Jesus into our hearts and souls, we allow him to nourish us to be able to go out into the world to make disciples of all nations.

Che Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ


Jesus died on the Cross and rose from the dead to save us from sin and death. And He promised that He would remain with us until the end of time: "Lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age" (Matt. 28:20).

Because He loves us, Jesus found a way to be Present to each person through all the generations. Jesus made a miracle happen at the Last Supper the night before He died, and that same miracle takes place at every Mass.

Jesus commanded that the bread and wine become His Body and Blood. We believe this miracle occurs because Jesus is God, and when He speaks, His Words become what they say.

He gave the power to turn bread and wine into His Body and Blood to the Apostles, who were the first Bishops. They in turn passed it down to all priests who receive the Sacrament of Holy Orders.

When the priest says "This is My Body," it is really Jesus speaking through him, making the miracle happen.

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Ex 24:3-8 | Heb 9:11-15 | Mk 14:12-16, 22-26

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

It takes only a few moments of holding one's breath to realize how desperately we need oxygen to survive. If only we were always as cognizant and mindful of the importance of the Eucharist for the same reason! I, for one, confess to approach-Ing the altar with fervent belief in the body, blood, soul, and divinity of Christ, but also at times doing so while distracted or not fully appreciative of the gift being given to me. But today's solemnity is a powerful reminder not to take the Eucharist for granted. It is the Church's formal and official homage to Jesus Christ who, "with his own blood" obtained for us eternal redemption. St. Thomas Aquinas offers this description of how wonderful, precious, and important the Eucharist Is with the following words: "The only-begotten Son of God, wishing to enable us to share in his divinity, assumed our nature, so that by becoming man he might make us gods." (Opusc. 57, 1-4) Like the disciples on the night of the Last Supper, we, too, receive the body and blood of Jesus under the appearance of bread and wine. He dwells within us, intercedes for us, and through grace he transforms us.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Spending time with our Lord at Eucharistic adoration is a profound opportunity to open our hearts to him. Just as we know that we cannot love others well if we don't love ourselves, likewise we cannot share the love of Christ with others well if we don't take time to allow Christ to enter our hearts and our lives. By taking the time to talk to Jesus and listen, we can, in turn, witness to his love to others. We can use this time to pray for a specific person, seek help with a personal dilemma, or ask the Lord to show us where we need repentance and conversion in our own lives so as to be more like him. The more we are conformed to Christ, the better we can bring Christ to the world.
