


Message from Father Bobbin

Dear Parishioners,

Continuing our tour of the Bible... Last week we noted that the Old Testament has four collections of books. The first collection is called the *Pentateuch*, or the *Law*. It contains the first five books of the Bible. It is regarded by the Jewish people as the most important part of the Scriptures. These five books, Genesis through Deuteronomy, contain a variety of literature: stories about the origins of the world, humanity, and the need for salvation; historical information about the origins of God's People; laws, rules, and regulations that govern the life of God's People.

Before we look at each of these five books, we need to keep in mind that the Bible, for all of its variety, is not a random collection of writings. The reason certain books have been accepted into the Sacred Scriptures by the Jewish people and by Christians is that they have something to say about the story of salvation. As we tour the Bible, we need to be attentive to the story: how each book fits into the big picture. We never take anything in the Bible out of context or we risk misinterpreting it. The writings of the Bible are divinely inspired. What is God's message to us?

The Solemnity of the Birth of St. John the Baptist - June 24th

On December the 25th, we celebrate the big one—the birthday of Jesus, the Word of God made flesh. The Church actually does not celebrate the birthday of the saints, except that of Jesus' mother and one notable exception.

Since we celebrate the birthday of the Word, we also celebrate the birthday of the **Voice**. We're referring to Jesus' cousin of course, John the Baptist, the Voice crying out in the wilderness.

John plays a unique role in the history of salvation. We call him the Baptist. Eastern Christians call him the Forerunner. Only Luke's gospel tells us of the marvelous circumstances surrounding his birth. But each of the four gospels tells us of his essential work in preparing the way for Jesus. But they also tell us something further—that John was a model of the key virtue of *humility* extolled by the first Beatitude of the Sermon on the Mount—*Blessed are the Poor in Spirit*.
