Message from Father Bobbin

Dear Parishioners,

Last week we were making some observations about the Gospel According to Mark. We mentioned that many believe Mark wrote his Gospel for the Christian community of Rome. One thing is certain: Mark's Gospel is addressed to Gentile Christians, not Christians of Jewish background. Take a look at Mark 7:1-4 and notice how he explains the Jewish customs. He does not assume his readers are familiar with Jewish customs. Another clue that points to a Gentile audience is that, in what is arguably the climax of the Gospel – the death of Jesus – it is the Roman centurion (a Gentile) who proclaims Jesus to be the Son of God (We'll come back to this.).

Here are various features of Mark's Gospel... The Gospel begins by introducing John the Baptist and then the adult Jesus comes on the scene. There are no Infancy Narratives (Christmas stories) in Mark's Gospel. There is an abruptness to Mark's Gospel. As we already mentioned, the language is very simple. The action moves quickly. Jesus is shown as always on the move. Read chapter 1, which strings together several events in Jesus's ministry. You should be exhausted by the time you get to chapter 2.

Although Mark is brief, he is also very descriptive. Some of his passages are actually longer and more descriptive than the parallel passages in Matthew or Luke. There are a few instances where Mark begins a story, interrupts it with another story, and then picks up the first story. This is called intercalation or, if you prefer more technical language, a "marcan sandwich."

One interesting feature of the Gospel is multiple endings... The end of the original manuscript seems to have been cut off. Based on the available early manuscripts of Mark, there is a "Longer Ending" (which is considered the canonical ending), a "Shorter Ending" and at least one other ending.
