FROM OUR PARISH NURSE ... Too much sugar may be bad for your mood, suggests a British study in *Scientific* reports, which tracked the diets and health of 8,000 people, none of whom were being treated for mental illness at the start. Compared to men who consumed the least sugar (less than 40 grams a day) from sweets such as cakes, candies, and ice cream as well as sugary beverages, men who consumed the most sugar (more than 67 grams a day) were 23% more likely to be diagnosed with depressive symptoms over a fiveyear period. For perspective, a12-ounce can of soda has about 40 grams of sugar. No association was seen in women, however, perhaps because of their smaller number in the study, gender differences in depression pathology, or chance.

CEMETERY REGULATIONS

The following are guidelines established by St. John's Cemetery Committee:

- Shrubs are not permitted on cemetery grounds except those authorized by cemetery authorities.
- Flowers or plants may be planted in the ground, but must remain within 12 inches of base of memorial.
- All artificial decorations must be removed within 14 days after specified holidays which are: Easter, Mother's Day, Memorial Day, Father's Day, Christmas.
- All decorations except those flowers or plants planted in the ground, must be removed.
- Placing of artificial flowers in the ground is forbidden.
- All rubbish is to be taken with you or placed in receptacles in Cemetery.
