

Message from Father Bobbin

Dear Parishioners,

Last week we were describing the Gospel According to Luke. Here are more features of Luke's Gospel to distinguish it from the other Gospels.

Like Matthew, Luke begins his Gospel with two chapters of Infancy Narratives, stories of the birth of Jesus. But Luke's Infancy Narratives are much longer and more complex than Matthew's. Luke weaves together the accounts of the birth of Jesus and the birth of John the Baptist. Luke's Infancy Narrative includes all of the episodes from which we derive the Joyful Mysteries of the rosary: the Annunciation, Visitation, Birth of Jesus, Presentation, and Finding of Jesus in the Temple.

Another important difference from Matthew's Gospel is that Luke is clearly writing for Christians of Gentile background. Luke places much less emphasis on Jesus fulfilling the Old Testament. His Gospel is filled with a sense of universality: Jesus comes as Savior for all people, not one nation alone. While Matthew tends to present Jesus as Teacher or Rabbi, Luke emphasizes Jesus as Healer (consistent with Luke's background as a physician). Jesus is presented as compassionate and forgiving. Other themes emphasized in Luke's Gospel include the role of the Holy Spirit, prayer, and the demands of discipleship.

Many of these themes can be seen in the well-known stories that are unique to Luke's Gospel: the parable of the Good Samaritan, the parable of the Prodigal Son, Jesus's visit to the home of Martha and Mary, and Jesus forgiving both the executioners and the criminal dying next to Him on the cross.


