Dear Parishioners,

The readings for this Sunday wrestle with the questions of who is in and who is out.

In the first reading for this Sunday the Lord speaks through Isaiah giving his promise that all who hold to his covenant will be brought to his holy mountain. In the second reading St. Paul tells the Gentiles that God delivered all to disobedience that he might have mercy upon all. And in the gospel a Canaanite woman asked Christ to have pity on her for her daughter is tormented by a demon. In spite of initial rejection the woman perseveres in faith and Jesus heals her daughter.

When it comes to God's grace, who will receive it? We learned from these readings that all who accept the gift of faith are incorporated into the covenant relationship with God. God's grace and mercy are promised to all.
