

Message from Father Bobbin

Dear Parishioners,

As we journey through the Historical Books of the Old Testament, last week we came to the defeat and exile of God's People first by the Assyrians, then by the Babylonians. This brings us to the end of the Deuteronomic History (the books of Joshua, Judges, Samuel, and Kings). By 587 BC the leaders, upper classes, and skilled people of Judah were exiled to Babylon (which means they lost the *Promised Land*), the holy city Jerusalem was destroyed, the Temple (God's dwelling with His People) was destroyed, and there would no longer be a king in the line of David ruling God's people. From now on, the Chosen People would be ruled by foreign empires. Last week we ended with the question: why would God allow this? It seemed like God's plan of salvation was over.

Around the time of the Babylonian Exile, prophets like Isaiah and Ezekiel taught the Chosen People that the God of Israel was not *defeated by* these foreign empires. Quite the opposite. God was *using* these enemy nations to punish His people for their infidelity to the covenant. This means there is hope for the future. By repenting and turning back to God, the people would be restored. Isaiah predicts a return from exile as great as the Exodus from Egypt. Eventually there would be a new king in the line of David (a "Son of David" or Messiah) who would rule in Jerusalem, which would become the source of salvation for the entire world.

While the Deuteronmic History ends with the fall of Jerusalem to Babylon, we can now turn to another collection of Old Testament Historical Books: the "Chronicler's History." This is made up of the books of 1 and 2 Chronicles, Ezra, and Nehemiah. Much of the history recounted in these books is the same as in the Deuteronomic History. But Ezra and Nehemiah take us beyond the Babylonian Exile and recount the return to Judah. In 537 BC the Persians conquered Babylon and allowed the conquered peoples to return to their homelands. God's people returned to Judah, rebuilt Jerusalem and the Temple, and renewed their fidelity to the covenant with God. However, they were not independent. Judah was a province of the Persian Empire. So there was no king. Hope for a future king – a Messiah – continued to grow.




