FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

In this Sunday's gospel Jesus reveals that He must suffer greatly, and Peter attempts to dissuade Him. Jesus accuses Peter of thinking, not as God does, but as human beings do. He then tells His disciples that in order to follow Him they must take up their cross.

Peter can be excused for thinking as humans do, for he is human. But what gets him in trouble is his mistaken idea that he knows better than Jesus – that he knows better how Jesus out to carry out His mission. This is reminiscent of the Fall, pride in one's own knowledge over that of God's. We are all susceptible to that, and Jesus reminds Peter – and us – that His way is the way. All we need to do is trust and to follow.
