

Message from Father Bobbin

Dear Parishioners,

It has been twenty years since the events of September 11, 2001. Most of us who lived through those events can probably remember very distinctly where we were when we heard the news of the terrorist attacks in our own country. It is hard to believe it has already been twenty years. Sadly, there have been many more instances of violence around the world in the last two decades. Society has changed, in some ways for the better, in other ways not so much.

Perhaps the most unsettling thing about 9/11 is that it was the first time many of us were confronted by evil, especially on such a magnitude. It is hard to look at the events of 9/11 and deny that there is such a thing as evil, whether it is evil that originates in the human heart, or through demonic influences, or both working together.

In today's Gospel, Jesus reveals the core of His identity as the Messiah: He will be rejected and killed, but then rise. To be His followers, we must also share something of Jesus' cross and self-sacrifice in order to rise to new life. Jesus made Himself a "lightning rod", so to speak, for evil. By taking the sin and evil of the world upon Himself, and then rising again, He showed that evil will never have the final word. The worst evils that we can experience in this world are only temporary and cannot conquer us, unless we allow them to.

We continue to pray for all people who have suffered and may still be suffering as result of the events of 9/11. Our prayers are just one way that the evil of that day is being conquered. We pray for an end to terrorism and war and for greater peace and security at home and around the world. But, as disciples of Jesus, we know that our deepest source of peace is the truth that all things will be set right in the end and that new life in Christ awaits us.


Sacred Meal, Sacrifice, Real Presence

Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Is 50:5-9a | Jas 2:14-18 | Mk 8:27-35

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

I think it can be easy to romanticize faith: the post-retreat high, the inspirational homily, even the motivational wall art that pops up on Pinterest. But *keeping* the faith can be hard sometimes. And living it out? Even harder. Today's readings both challenge and encourage us, as they so often do. The Letter of James pulls no punches: Faith without works is "dead." And in today's Gospel, right after Peter says, "You are the Christ," Jesus tempers that Good News, telling him that even the Son of Man must suffer greatly. We who follow Jesus must also be willing to take up our cross. This is a daily challenge to choose life over death; to choose the transformative power of Jesus over sin that creeps into our lives; to make the choice to put others' needs before our own. None of this is easy. But as the prophet Isaiah reminds us, we don't have to do it alone; indeed, the Lord God is our help. We can choose well.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

I'm inspired when the young people in our parish assist with the Sunday liturgy and do service projects in the community. As a working parent (and back when I was a "stay-at-home" mom), I tell myself, maybe someday when things slow down, I'll do more. But honestly, I think the teens in the youth group – between work, school, and sports – are busier than I am. As we listen to today's readings, wherever we may be in life and faith, what stands out? Is it James' entreaty to pair faith with works? Or Jesus' words that "whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it"? Or the prophet Isaiah's rock-solid faith? Today's readings give us many ways to witness to our faith in Jesus – through prayer, service, generosity, perseverance, works, and words. We can ask the Holy Spirit to show us which of these gifts we can share with others this week.

ACTIONS Brainstorm new ways to witness to your faith. It could be as simple as picking up extra food for the pantry in the back of church or changing up "Grace" at dinner to add prayers for others.

Regulations / Guidelines

The following are guidelines established by St. John's Cemetery Committee ...

- * Shrubs are not permitted on cemetery grounds
- * Flowers or plants may be planted in the ground, but must remain within 12 inches of base of memorial. **NO** Perennials are permitted.
- * All artificial decorations must be removed within 14 days after specified holidays which are: Easter, Mother's Day, Memorial Day, Father's Day, July 4, Christmas, etc.
- * Placing of artificial flowers in the ground is forbidden
- * All rubbish is to be taken with you or placed in available receptacles located at top of cemetery
- * Please refrain from placing any tombstone in or on the grounds for one year after a death to allow the ground to settle back to its natural state.
