Labor disputes, like the one in this Sunday's gospel story, have a long history dating back to 1754 B.C.E. with the code of Hammurabi. It consists of 282 laws, including the famous ruling, "an eye for an eye, a tooth for a tooth." But, even that far back in time, they were still arguing over the wages to be paid to an ox driver, a surgeon or a day laborer.

This Sunday's gospel is not really about labor law. It is a powerful lesson which teaches us that God is offering us the gift of eternal life. There is no way that we could ever earn it, much less to deserve it. This gift comes from the pure goodness of God who loves us more than we can ever comprehend.



FROM OUR PARISH NURSE ...

You're never too old to register to be a kidney donor. in a recent Italian study in the Clinical Journal of the American Society of Nephrology has confirmed. It looked at the outcomes of 647 kidney transplants from deceased donors in four age groups: 50 to 59, 60 to 69, 70 to 79, and 80 and older. Average five-year survival rates of both the recipients and the organs were essentially the same across all donor age groups. There were also no differences in acute rejection of the kidneys, nor were most adverse events related to donor age. There was, however, a higher pre-transplant discard rate for kidneys from the eldest donors. Given the shortage of available kidneys, selecting donors on the basis of an age cutoff is "unjustified," the researchers concluded. You can register as an organ donor with Donate Life America at registerme.org, or you can indicate your intentions on your driver's license. You should also make sure your next-of-kin knows your wishes.
