

Message from Father Bobbin

Dear Parishioners,

This Thursday, October 7, the Church honors Mary as Our Lady of the Rosary. Traditionally October is the month of the rosary.

If you don't already pray the rosary, I encourage you to consider it. Some people may not be attracted to it because it seems long and repetitive. But, as my spiritual director once pointed out, you can pray one decade at a time as you go through the day instead of having to find 20 minutes to pray it all at once. It is a prayer that can be said while doing other things, like driving (which may also help mitigate some of those unholy thoughts toward your fellow drivers). So, time is not really an excuse.

Yes, the rosary seems repetitive (some would say boring). But it is meant as a tool for *meditation*. It is not necessary to pay attention to every word of every Hail Mary. Repeating the words of the prayers over and over again helps us clear our minds and think about the mysteries of the rosary or the people or needs we're praying for. Sometimes I think about a different person in my life on each Hail Mary. The repetitive nature of the rosary has a calming effect. I definitely experience this myself. I have even seen this calming effect on an entire student body of high school students.

Consider turning to the rosary or praying the rosary with renewed attention during this month of the rosary. It is a powerful spiritual tool and a powerful weapon against sin and evil. But most importantly it keeps us connected with Mary our Mother.

SCRIPTURE STUDY


Fr. Bobbin's Scripture Study

Today's readings bring these beautiful images to mind. In the Gospel, Jesus teaches his disciples about marriage: "God made them male and female. For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh." While the readings focus on the relationship between man and woman, we are reminded that God created all of us – no matter our state in life – to love one another as he loves us. The capacity to love is in our DNA. Jesus invites us to be companions on life's journey, reflecting to others Christ's love for the Church.

Each year in October, our diocese invites married couples to a "Wedding Anniversary Mass."
