FROM OUR PARISH NURSE ...

Does staying physically active improve cognitive function, or does high cognitive function enable older people to stay active and live more healthfully? Both, concludes a recent study in *Frontiers in Neuroscience*, which looked at 4,555 British people over age 50 and analyzed the relationship between physical activity and executive function (the ability to solve problems, set and meet goals, and exert self-control). It found that over a six-year period older people who were physically active tended to retain high executive function; the researchers controlled for variables such as age, gender, education, and health. Conversely, people with high executive function were more likely to stay physically active. It's a virtuous circle.
