ROSARY REPAIR

Parishioner, **Paul Gombola**, repairs rosaries on a case by case basis and each situation offers its own unique challenges. A damaged rosary can be dropped off at the Rectory or at Paul's home. If you have all the parts, a very simple repair is usually **FREE**. When the repair is more complex and requires additional parts or

rewiring, this can be accomplished with minimum cost for \$5 or \$10. In extreme cases where parts need to be ordered the repair cost can be \$20 or over. If your rosary is missing a piece of chain, a crucifix, centerpiece or several beads, Paul has several on hand and will attempt to match them as closely as possible. FIRST FRIDAY DEVOTION TO THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS

"WHERE THE LORD'S PRESENCE IS HONORED, REVERENCED AND ADORED IN EUCHARISTIC ADORATION, THE WHOLE CHURCH IS LIFTED UP AND STRENGTHENED."

The devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, which venerates and honors the heart of Jesus, became widespread through St. Margaret Mary Alacoque in 1675 within the octave of the Feast of Corpus Christi.When Jesus spoke to St. Margaret Mary and revealed the beauty and mercy of his heart to her, he spoke of several promises for those who reverence his heart, including an abundance of graces, blessings and even the conversion of the most hardened hearts. The 12 Promises of the Sacred Heart of Jesus made to St. Margaret Mary are:

I will give them all the graces necessary for their state in life.

- •I will establish peace in their families.
- •I will comfort them in their trials.
- ·I will be their secure refuge during life, and, above all, in death.
- ·I will shed abundant blessings on all their undertakings.
- Sinners will find in my heart an infinite ocean of mercy.
- Lukewarm souls will become fervent.
- •Fervent souls will rapidly grow in holiness and perfection.

I will bless every place where an image of my heart shall be exposed and honored.

•I will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts. The names of those who promote this devotion will be written in my heart, never to be blotted out.

I promise thee, in the excessive mercy of my heart, that my all-powerful love will grant

the First Friday of nine consecutive months, the grace of final penitence; they shall not one in my disgrace nor winnout receiving mensacraments; my divine heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment.

We will be honoring the First Friday Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus on <u>November 6 from 9</u> <u>a.m. to 5 p.m.</u> starting with <u>Mass</u> at 9 a.m., <u>Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament</u> followed by the <u>Litany of the Sacred Heart of Jesus</u> at 9:30 a.m., <u>Divine Mercy Chaplet</u> at 3 p.m., <u>Evening Prayer</u> <u>and Benediction</u> at 4:30 p.m. Sign up in the back of church for an hour. **We need 2 adorers for every hour.**

PRACTICAL TIPS FOR FORGIVENESS

- Recognize the person who hurt you is a fellow human being.
- Ask yourself, "What happened?"
- Surrender your right to "get even."
- Choose to forgive.
- Don't wait for the other person to ask forgiveness.
- Bless the other person.
- Distinguish between forgiveness and reconciliation.
- Learn to ask and receive forgiveness in daily living. Ask, "Would you please forgive me for ____?"
- Seek help if needed for major trauma or recurring abuse. Forgiveness does not mean you have to stay in harmful environments or situations.
- Take advantage of the Sacrament of Reconciliation.



Grow & Go

Solemnity of All Saints

Rv 7:2-4, 9-14; 1 Jn 3:1-3; Mt 5:1-12A

GROW: In journalism school, a professor admonished future reporters: "Show, don't tell." In other words, don't start a story with a generality such as: "It was a nice day." Instead, be specific: "The sun shone through the clouds and the air had a hint of the first snow." This Sunday, we hear Jesus not only tell us, but show us through the poetic language of the beatitudes what holiness looks like. As if that weren't enough, we celebrate All Saints' Day, honoring those holy men and women (known and unknown) in heaven whose lives exemplified the beatitudes. Jesus and the saints remind us that we cannot do it alone; we need God's help to live "blessed" lives. With God's grace, we, too, can aspire to holiness and sainthood.

GO: In his apostolic letter on the call to holiness, Pope Francis reminds us that the beatitudes are not simply platitudes. "Let us allow his words to unsettle us, to challenge us and to demand a real change in the way we live," he writes. "Otherwise, holiness will remain no more than an empty word." (*Gaudete et Exsultate* 66) He points out that we cannot do it alone, but only with the help of the Holy Spirit, who can free us from those stumbling blocks that may hold us back. Strengthened through prayer and the Eucharist, the road to holiness begins by putting one step in front of another – whether that means reordering our priorities, being more patient with our children, friends, or spouse – or aspiring to be what Pope Francis calls the saints next door: "Those who, living in our midst, reflect God's presence." (*GE* 7)

REFLECT: Read the section on the beatitudes in Chapter 3 of *Gaudete et Exsultate*, Pope Francis' 2018 apostolic letter on the call to holiness. Ask the Holy Spirit to help us become the saints "next door" to those we encounter in our daily lives.
