Dear Parishioners,

The theme that runs through this Sunday's readings is the fact that the God we worship is the God of the living. In the first reading from Maccabees, it recalls the bravery of seven brothers and their mother who preferred death to denying their hope in the God of Israel.

In the second reading, St. Paul reminds the Thessalonians of God's fidelity and encourages them to find hope and strength in the Lord. And in the gospel, Jesus being put on the spot, the Sadducees were unexpectedly rewarded with a firm declaration of the truth of the Resurrection. By proclaiming God to be the God of the living, Jesus strengthens the resolve of all who place their trust in Him and who hope to share in the eternal life of God.
