

## Message from Father Bobbin

Dear Parishioners,

As we continue our overview of the New Testament, we come to a group of Paul's letters known as the Captivity Letters because Paul wrote them from prison. They are the letters to the Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, and the letter to Philemon. These are all relatively short letters, especially Philemon: Paul's shortest letter at only 25 verses.

Ephesians was written to the Christians of Ephesus, a major city in Asia Minor. Colossians was written to Colossae, another city in Asia Minor, which no longer exists. Philippi was a city in northern Greece, where many retired Roman military officers lived. These letters cover a variety of topics about the centrality of Jesus Christ and living a Christian life. For example, Ephesians contains the famous (and usually misunderstood) passage that explains the sacrament of marriage as a sign of the relationship between Jesus and His Church (5:21-33).

The letter to Philemon is not written to a community but to an individual. Philemon was a Christian whose slave, Onesimus, ran away and eventually met Paul. Paul writes to Philemon urging him to take Onesimus back, not as a slave, but as a brother, a fellow Christian.

## GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

We don't have to look far to find grief, violence, or chaos in our world. Perhaps it has made its way into our community or has pierced our hearts in deeply personal ways. Or even if the chaos of life has remained at a distance for now, it can be tempting to wonder if the end is near at times. But Jesus warns us against catastrophic thoughts. Listen to what he says in today's Gospel, when asked how we will know the end time is coming: "When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for such things must happen first, but it will not immediately be the end." Jesus knew we would need his clear and steady reminder. If you find yourself fearing the state of the world, turn all your senses toward Jesus. Let your anxiety, grief, and concern become catalysts for prayer.

#### **GO EVANGELIZE**

#### PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Although today's Gospel may at first be one that stirs fear, as we look deeper we realize that Jesus is speaking directly into the heart of our fear and offering his profound consolation. There is so much in this Gospel that can encourage us to continue to bear witness to Christ even in trying times. As we scroll through the news each day, remember Jesus' words to not be "terrified." If you find yourself in circumstances where it's not easy to stand up for your faith, Jesus tells us, "I myself shall give you a wisdom in speaking that your adversaries will be powerless to resist or refute." And when you look to the future with dread, remember that Jesus says, "not a hair on your head will be destroyed." Read these words again, drawing comfort and strength that the Lord is with you, guiding and protecting you through it all.

## PRAY

If you find yourself feeling overwhelmed this week, pray the Prayer of St. Teresa of Ávila:

Let nothing disturb you, Let nothing frighten you, All things are passing away: God never changes. Patience obtains all things. Whoever has God lacks nothing; God alone suffices.
