What are Oplatki? For centuries on Christmas Eve, families in Poland, Lithuania, the Czech and Slav Republics have practiced a beautiful tradition. It is the breaking and sharing of the Oplatek – Christmas Wafer. Oplatek taken from the Latin word oblatum, meaning Sacred Bread, has been the symbol of Christianity and Jesus Christ our bread of life since the Last Supper.

The host or hostess leads in a special prayer and distributes an oplatek to the participants. Each person breaks off a piece of the other's oplatek and continues until they have exchanged good wishes and blessings with everyone. **Oplatki are available at the Rectory.**

#### STEWARDSHIP LIBRARY

FROM OUR PARISH NURSE ... Treating obstructive sleep apnea (OSA) may help reduce depressive symptoms, according to data from the international multi-center SAVE (Sleep Apnea CardioVascular Endpoints) trial, which included 2,410 OSA patients who also had cardiovascular disease. They were assigned to either CPAP (continuous positive airway pressure, the standard treatment for OSA), plus usual care or usual care alone (control group) for about four years. As reported in EClinicalMedicine, use of CPAP reduced the cases of depression by 20%, as assessed at baseline and regularly over the course of the study, independent of improvements in daytime sleepiness. The effects were apparent within a few months of starting treatment and were greater in those with pre-existing depression symptoms. A review of other randomized trials done by the researchers and reported in the same paper (involving more than 4,200 people with OSA) further supported the depressionreducing effects of CPAP. There is a strong relationship between sleep problems and depression, as well as between cardiovascular events and depression.
