

Message from Father Bobbin

Dear Parishioners,

We have been looking at the Old Testament prophets in roughly chronological order. The last couple weeks we came to the books of Jeremiah, Lamentations, and Baruch. These books reflect the time when Babylon conquered Jerusalem and exiled many of the people from the Promised Land. This was a cataclysmic event in Old Testament history.

The prophet Ezekiel, one of the four major prophets, lived during the Babylonian Exile. The prophet himself was in one of the first groups to be deported to Babylon, where he prophesied in the final years leading up to the fall of Jerusalem. Like Jeremiah, he calls out God's people for their flagrant infidelity to the covenant and warns of the destruction to come if they do not change. After Babylon conquers Jerusalem, Ezekiel's prophecy is characterized by oracles of hope for salvation. God will restore His people.

Ezekiel is unique in that much of his prophecy comes not just in words but in the form of strange visions and symbolic actions that God asks him to perform. For example, God tells Ezekiel to pack his bags and dig through the city wall to foreshadow the people going into exile.

There are many striking passages in Ezekiel. See, for example, chapter 36, a foreshadowing of Baptism, and chapter 37 for a dramatic vision of the future resurrection of God's people. The book ends with a vision of a restored Temple, which is significant in light of the destruction of the Temple by the Babylonians.



For centuries on Christmas Eve, families in Poland, Lithuania, Czech Republic and Slovakia have practiced a beautiful tradition. It is the breaking and sharing of the Oplatek - Christmas Wafer. Oplatek taken from the Latin word oblatum, meaning Sacred Bread, has been the symbol of Christianity and Jesus Christ our bread of life since the Last Supper. The host or hostess leads in a special prayer and distributes an oplatek to the participants. Each person breaks off a piece of the other's oplatek and continues until they have exchanged good wishes and blessings with everyone.

DO YOU HAVE A LOVED ONE IN THE HOSPITAL?

The HIPPA privacy protection act prohibits the release of patient information admitted to hospitals or nursing homes. Each facility interprets HIPPA differently which often precludes the sharing of this information with your pastor.

In the event of a loved one being hospitalized or admitted to a long term care facility, an authorized family member should inform the parish office.

If Father's schedule permits he will visit your loved one. Remember the number of our priests in the area have dwindled. If it is an EMERGENCY, we will have a priest attend to your loved ones needs in a timely fashion. Please do not wait until the last possible moment to contact a priest. Please also note that patients admitted through the Emergency Room are not asked to specify a religion/priest/or parish.
