

Message from Father Bobbin


Dear Parishioners,

Over these four Sundays of Advent, we reflect on four spiritual realities that are traditionally symbolized by the four candles of the Advent wreath. The candle for the First Sunday of Advent represents hope. The candle for the Second Sunday of Advent represents *faith*.

There is a lot we can say about faith. When I teach about faith, especially with kids, I like to cut through all the discussion and offer the simplest definition possible. Faith is a relationship with God. Faith is the gift of a relationship with God which begins (formally) with our Baptism. From that moment on, we are called to grow in faith by growing in a relationship with God, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Advent calls us to prepare for two comings of Christ: His future coming at the end of the world (or, more likely His "coming" to us at the moment of our deaths), and also the celebration of His coming in history: Christmas. In between these two comings stands the present moment. Jesus is with us right now. We encounter His presence in daily prayer, in the sacraments, in the inspired words of Sacred Scripture, and in the people and experiences that make up any given day of our lives. Besides being faithful to the sacraments, we need to invite Him into every single day through prayer and reflection. This helps us grow in a relationship with Him, growing in faith. We will more deeply understand and appreciate His coming on Christmas, and we will be better prepared to meet Him in the future because that moment of meeting Jesus face-to-face will not be the awkward meeting of strangers but the joyful reunion of loved ones.

Christmas Wafers "Oplatki"

For centuries on Christmas Eve, families in Poland, Lithuania, Czech Republic and Slovakia have practiced a beautiful tradition. It is the breaking and sharing of the Oplatek – Christmas Wafer. Oplatek taken from the Latin word oblatum, meaning Sacred Bread, has been the symbol of Christianity and Jesus Christ our bread of life since the Last Supper. The host or hostess leads in a special prayer and distributes an oplatek to the participants. Each person breaks off a piece of the other's oplatek and continues until they have exchanged good wishes



and blessings with everyone. Oplatki are available at the Rectory — Monday thru Thursday.

Is 40:1-5, 9-11 | 2 Pt 3:8-14 | Mk 1:1-8

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Can you hear it? The voice crying out in the desert? While John the Baptist was the one literally proclaiming, from the desert, the coming of the Lord, we should listen for echoes of his message today. John foretold that Jesus - the Father's Incarnate Son - was on his way to redeem the world. Through Jesus' passion and death, the gates of heaven were flung open so all who believe in him would have eternal life. This is the Good News he proclaimed then, and the Church proclaims today: Christ has come! Christ has died, Christ is risen, and Christ will come again. This is what we prepare for in Advent - to celebrate, on Christmas day, Christ's coming into the world, and that he will one day return in glory. The Lord gives comfort to his people in his words, and in his presence to us in the Eucharist: "According to his promise we await new heavens and a new earth in which righteousness dwells." So, trust in the Lord, remain vigilant, and take heed of the voices that remind us to "prepare the way of the Lord."

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Each year, we are given the gift of Advent. It is a season that invites us to slow down, reflect on the gift of Jesus and prepare to celebrate the Nativity of the Lord. Ironically, though, it happens at one of the most frenzied times of the year as we rush to keep up with cookie baking, tree decorating and merry-making. Advent is short - it includes four Sundays but can be three to four weeks long depending on the weekday upon which Christmas falls and it sometimes doesn't seem long enough to truly prepare our hearts. This year Advent is three weeks and a day - so we are close to reaching the midway point, which is a good time to ask ourselves: How tuned in are we to John the Baptist's message? If we feel like we're being carried along in a wave of consumerism, it's not too late to make a course correction. We can step away from the fray and carve out time to enjoy the stillness of Advent and truly listen to the voice crying out in the desert.

SING Furrows, be glad. Though earth is bare. One more seed is planted there: Give up your strength the seed to nourish, That in course the flower may flourish. People, look east and sing today: Love, the rose, is on the way.
