HEALTHY NOTES ... If you're a man who is a current or former smoker, you're at increased risk for bone loss, osteoporosis, and fractures, a new study in the Annals of the American Thoracic Society has confirmed, and you should talk with your doctor about having your bone mineral density measured. It's well known that smoking weakens bones, but this study suggests that the effect is even worse for men than for women. The study looked at 3,300 current and exsmokers (who smoked at least one pack a day for 10 years or the equivalent), ages 45 to 80, and found that, all things being equal, the men were even more likely to have low bone density and vertebral fractures than the women. Men with chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), including emphysema, were at especially high risk. For more on bone health recommendations for men, go to tinyurl.com/WLosteo
