Message from Father Bobbin


Dear Parishioners,

As we journey through the books of the Bible, we come to a couple more of the Old Testament prophets.

The Book of Obadiah is the shortest book of the Old Testament: only 21 verses. This brief text is unusual because it does not call God's people to conversion like most of the other prophets. Rather, it is a prophecy against Edom, one of Israel's traditional enemies. The tension between Israel and Edom goes back to the story of Jacob and Esau in the Book of Genesis. Jacob steals the birthright of his older brother Esau. Jacob becomes the next patriarch of God's people (his name becomes "Israel") while Esau comes to represent the nation of Edom. (In the story, Esau is described as "red." *Edom* means "red" in Hebrew.)

The prophet Joel, like many of the prophets, calls Israel to conversion. God's people must learn from their past mistakes that resulted in the destruction of Jerusalem and exile in Babylon. He foresees a restored Jerusalem that will not only be significant for Israel, but for the world. Joel calls the people to repent in the face of the Day of the Lord, a time of judgment. Every year on Ash Wednesday, the first reading of the Mass is taken from Joel (2:12-18): a call to repentance as we begin the Lenten season.
