FROM OUR PARISH NURSE ... Janet Daubert Women who drink regular coffee may be at lower risk for developing depression. In a Harvard study of more than 50,000 nurses, recently in the *Archives of Internal Medicine*, women who drank two or three cups of coffee a day were 15% less likely to develop depression over a ten-year period than those who drank little or no coffee.
